Macular Degeneration Awareness Week - June 5 to June 11 2006

This year's MD Awareness Week adopted an Australian theme to highlight the impact of central vision loss caused by Macular Degeneration. The campaign included the use of a community service announcement aired on major TV and radio networks across Australia.

During the campaign, over 27,000 posters and more than 190,000 flyers were sent to optometrists, ophthalmologists, selected GPs, podiatrists, pharmacies and health food stores.

The Foundation's Tasmanian support group held a successful launch on Saturday 3 June at Wrest Point, Sandy Bay.

In Queensland, the Rotary Club of Burleigh Heads also contributed by supporting a local advertising campaign.

In Sydney, the official launch was held on Tuesday 6 June at NSW Parliament House. Guest speaker Elizabeth Carr, an inaugral member of the Foundation, spoke with passion about the effect of MD on her late father and the recent diagnosis of her mother. She also outlined the increased level of support now available since the Foundation's inception. Chairman Leslie Lofthouse welcomed all attendees whilst Dr Paul Beaumont discussed the changing landscape of MD treatments. Board Member Peter Brown then launched the new publication Low Vision - A Guide.


Low Vision - A Guide
